for that. And, in addition, usually they require a blood panel, but because I was in good health and this was clearly elective surgery, (and a blood panel is expensive), they would waive that requirement as well.

So, how much abundance can one person take? Right now I have a positive expectation the colonoscopy will be easy and effortless and that my health is good. Abundance. And even the possibility that they may give me a discount on the rest of the fee (around \$1600) — but this is not a demand, but a "perhaps". And if they don't, that is OK also, since I already feel like I have been treated respectfully, and kindly.

The most important piece that is missing here, that would have blocked this positive creation and the arrival of abundance, would have been some lower self, child consciousness negativity around money, my health, doctors, etc. (For example, if I was resentful that I had to pay so much, I might have done an extensive search to find the cheapest doctor, gotten angry that it was "so" expensive, gone into fear and despair that no one wants to take care of me, etc.)

The piece around negativity must be addressed or you will continue to spin your wheels and wonder where the abundance is that everyone, i.e. "The Secret", talks about. No matter what you want, and no matter how much you want it, there could still be a part of you that really doesn't want it, and without discovering this part, abundance and positive creation will be illusive. This is the area in which the Pathwork shines. This story I have written, could only have happened after years of work on my own negative creations, and daily introspection, and walking my Path. Thank you, Pathwork!!!

admit to an explosion of mini-ER's during this season of the year.
Hidden just beneath the surface has been this gnawing irritation.
Watching and often enough being a part of the frenzy of shopping, wrapping, cooking, baking, traveling that often marks this time of the year – I would feel rumblings from an unknown source. Not quite Scrooge or the Grinch but clearly in that direction.

When I finally focused inward to ask what was going on in me, what finally surfaced was a set of feelings reactive to the word holiday. A set of feelings that I didn't even know I had. Those feelings included anger, disappointment, frustration and sadness. Mostly I was awash with a deep sense of sadness. A deep sadness that we collectively seem to have forsaken our spirituality to the point that we seem so hesitant to even name a holy day holy. Maybe its embarrassment and/or shame of our higher selves.

I am not an etymologist, ( I think that is what they call those word detectives who search out the roots of words.) but it is my layperson assumption that holiday is derived from holy day and just possibly Christmas is rooted in Christ Mass.

And although it may seem trivial – we know that it is important how we name things – that there is power in the word -

- that the expression shapes and informs how and what we experience. What would our experience be if this was the holy season rather than the holidays?

So I have taken up the cause, not a big cause, without demand or forcing. Well in truth it is hard for me release all forcing, it is so habitual. So if you detect a subtle forcing current in this, I apologize in advance. And ask you to just let that part of my message evaporate. For myself it is my intention to put the holy back in holiday – at least for those holy days that are clearly based in spiritual traditions.

What that means for me is to be conscious of my use of the word, holiday, particularly when referring to the days we call Christmas, Hanukkah, Easter, Yom Kippur, Rosh Hashanah and Ramadan and to begin to speak the word holy day in its stead. And to watch my own hesitations, where I tighten and cringe, what is the fear and to open to where it may feel healing to do so. I take this on as a spiritual practice curious at to whether the so naming shifts my experience.

If there is a part of you that resonates with this, I offer it to you as a spiritual practice and I would be interested in knowing what you learn about yourself and if there is any shifts in your experience of these holy days.



Tell me about abundance.

What does the Pathwork say about manifestation and abundance?

A The process of manifestation and tapping into the abundance of the Universe are all covered in our fifth year of Pathwork Transformation program, because it is a very deep process. However, I'd like to tell you a story that illustrates how it might work.

This year I am undergoing some elective healthcare procedures for prevention. One of those is a colonoscopy. Because I do not carry healthcare insurance, (a conscious choice as a self-employed person), I needed to find out the costs in the local area. I called three offices, and one office was particularly helpful. So helpful, that I intuitively chose this office because of the positive energy around my situation. (One office refused to treat me because of the lack of medical insurance.)

I was told that the initial consultation with the doctor would cost me \$245. I asked if there was a scale for self-pay, and they said no. Okay — I surrendered to the charge, knowing that I had chosen to not be insured. The office visit was splendid — the office staff as helpful in person as over the phone. The doctor came out into the waiting room, greeted me warmly. We spent about 15 minutes reviewing the procedure; then we scheduled it.

As I was waiting at the front desk to receive my colon prep instructions, the receptionist excused herself to talk with the doctor before finishing up with me. When she returned, she asked me how much the billing office had quoted for the office visit. I told her \$245. She said that she had discussed this with the doctor, and they decided to treat me like a returning patient, instead of a new patient, so the fee would only be \$75. Abundance. Unexpected, not demanded, but here it was. Then, she handed me a bottle of prescription pills for the colon prep and explained that since the drug representative had been there the previous day, she had an entire bottle of samples and there would also be no charge See I'm Glad You Asked, Page 2
